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ABOUT THE COURSE

This course is an introduction to the fundamental principles and procedures of empirical research in sociology. Students will be presented with the theoretical and practical challenges involved in problem formulation, research design, data collection, and data analysis. We will examine some of the major types of both qualitative and quantitative social research methods (e.g., structured interviews, questionnaires, qualitative interviews, and ethnography) and the sampling, measurement and analysis issues involved with their use. Students will be asked to conduct and report a basic qualitative research project.
