KEYNOTE ADDRESS

Demographic Transition and Social Stratification in Asia



Professor Yeung is a Provost-Chair Professor in the NUS Sociology Department and Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine. Prior to NUS, her academic history includes time at the University of Michigan and New York University. She is the founding Director of the Center for Family and Population Research in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences at NUS. She is an international advisor for several family panel studies in the world. Currently, she leads a project on Singapore preschool children's development - Singapore Longitudinal EArly Development Study (SG LEADS). Professor Yeung has published extensively and has been on the editorial boards of several top-ranking international journals such as Demography, Journal of Marriage and Family, Child Development, Social Science Research, and Journal of Family Issues, and on numerous scientific review committees and advisory boards. Professor Yeung's current research includes various family demographic issues in Asia and in America. Her work appears in leading journals and is cited widely in academic publications and highimpact media such as BBC News and The Economist. Her recent publications include changing family values and behavior, children's well-being, human capital, and aging.
